Content

The aim of the course is students to acquire basic knowledge regarding the effect of European integration into the Greek Economy. The principal theoretical and empirical approach followed is founded on the theory of economic integration and its consequences for member countries. The particular themes of the course, namely, are the evolving institutional framework of the European Economic Community (EEC)/European Commission (EC), the linkage between Greece and the EEC during the decade of '60s, the accession in the decade of '80s, the exchanges and trade, the resources and transfers towards Greece, the Economic and Monetary Union (EMU), the Euro and the Eurozone, the contemporary crisis. The lectures are accomplished with deliberations on the future of the EC taking into consideration BREXIT and other issues that arise in the process of European integration. Written assignments of students are accepted after agreement with the instructor.
