

Introduction to Social and Political Philosophy. Theory and Philosophy of Education

(A' semester, compulsory)

The aim of the course is to introduce students to key topics of Social and Political Philosophy, as well as to the fundamental issues of the theory and philosophy of education, through the discussion of the basic assumptions of the Ancient Greek Social and Political Philosophy. The main axis of reference is the Sophists, Plato, Aristotle and Thucydides. In this regard, the perception of Ancient Greek Philosophy is considered from the perspective of the philosophy of the 19th and the 20th century, as well as from the perspective of contemporary Greek ideology.
