### Preamble by the The President of the Department

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*The Department of Sociology of the School of Social Sciences at Panteion University of Social and Political Sciences is the first Department of Sociology to be established in Greece. It has been operating since 1984 and in 2020 closes thirty-six years of uninterrupted operation. Covers and serves teaching and research in a wide range of disciplines. Within the Department of Sociology, there are four Sectors: General Sociology, Modern Greek Society, Social Morphology and Criminology. It has developed and is currently in operation two Postgraduate Programs (MSc): "Sociology" and "Criminology". Our Department also participates in the Interdepartmental Program of Postgraduate Studies "Gender, Society, Politics" of Panteion University.*

*The Department of Sociology participates with great demands and a very significant range of work in the study of analytical issues of Sociology and the systematic investigation of social problems in Greek society or the world, either with theoretical approaches or with empirical (qualitative and quantitative) investigations. The excellent and extensive scientific work of the members of the Department is accompanied by the many and remarkable doctoral dissertations, which have been prepared, supported and approved in the context of its operation. Doctors of the Department of Sociology have been distinguished, in academic institutions, as teachers, professors of various levels or, even, have been elected to higher academic positions, at Panteion University and other academic Institutions. The basic research within the Department is supplemented by proposals of its members in key subjects, which aim at addressing critical issues of the social organization and its institutions. The knowledge and capabilities of the members of the Department have, for many years, become the motivation for their utilization in public institutions of Greek society. *Many of the graduates of the Department of Sociology are Teachers in Secondary Education, while many thousands work as civil servants and officials or as executives in the private sector. Most of the graduates of the Department have a long, now, active course in employment, despite the undoubted suffering of society in the ten years of the financial crisis. We are confident that the graduates of the Department, having systematic and solid knowledge for the study of social realities, will contribute to the fruitful reconstruction of the creative forces of Greek society. Their contribution and intellectual impulses are reasonable to cause them to be exploited by public institutions and private or cooperative bodies. In fact, it is inevitable that they play, with the scientific dynamics they have, a key role in the administration of society and its institutions. The executives of the Department hope that this contribution of its graduates will contribute decisively to the rapid economic progress and prosperity, with the support of individual and social rights, with the strengthening of the freedom and political rights of the people, with full and substantial equality and by strengthening the cooperative ventures and structures, which multiply the individual possibilities and create real estates for the solidary social coexistence, that is, for the real brotherhood. In that expected social perspective, the involvement of sociologists in the administration is going to exist*

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*from the most often unjust, the orphan (in terms of motives and purposes), the twisted or arbitrary (in terms of the use of means of enforcement) and the rather selfish exercise of power, over individuals and social groups. The administration must be a key, but awkward, action in dealing with individuals, ie it must be either a management of things (or impersonal social relations) or a management of institutionalized technical arrangements, with a strategy of equal participation of citizens in the socially beneficial and collective prosperity.*

*Studies in Sociology, then, make sense and meet immediate social needs. Sociology is a science of modernity. It is born from the crystallization of the institutions of the bourgeois revolutions and the industrial revolution. It is applied in all its versions, despite the fact that it has a wide cognitive depth. As it is created in an environment unprecedented for the history of humanity, pluralism, it incorporates the tensions of all social subjects, their logics and their social strategies. It has, therefore, the same potential of tensions and controversies, for which democracy is famous. Sociology does not tolerate two things: fascism and racism of any kind. For this reason it was abolished by the fascist regimes, dictatorships, while at the same time its officials were persecuted.*

*It is a fact that the students of the Department of Sociology are part of a new and very interesting world. The process of their training is complex and demanding. It contains the need for a disciplined and, in some technical aspects, meticulous study of the given cognitive spectrum of science. The temporary subordination of the scholar to the demand for critical reproduction of existing knowledge goes hand in hand with the cultivation of the necessary scientific freedom. The latter is the antechamber for fruitful sociological research and the continuous production of new knowledge, by utilizing the test components of scientific analysis and by vehicles: doubt, well-founded questioning, the projection of critical revisions or even the promotion of reversals of theoretical choices and of approach methods. Based on the above, be sure that the demanding approach to visas, methods or techniques of studying social realities is thorough. This science, Sociology, while pressing extremely well on the ground of reality, has no practical limits. Its limits are the dreams of a fertile and prosperous society. Make your own choices.*

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### *1. Presentation of the Department of Sociology*

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#### **1.1 History of Department**

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The Department of Sociology of Panteion University of Social and Political Sciences is located in the classic building of the University in Athens. It is the first Department of Sociology in Greece.

The development of the Department of Sociology was the base for the development of the Social Sciences at the Panteion School of Political Science (which was the second University Institution in Greece, founded in 1928), and the Department of Sociology gradually emerged from the Department of Sociology.

Today the Department of Sociology is the first largest Department of the University in terms of number of faculty members and the second largest Department in terms of number of active students.

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### 1.3 Scope and objectives of the Department

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The Department of Sociology of Panteion University is the first Department of Sociology in the country. It was founded in 1983 by the reconstitution of Panteion Higher School of Political Science (PASPE), in which three main Departments were created. The Department of Political Science, the Department of Public Administration and the Department of Sociology. The Panteion School of Political Science, the second essentially University Institution of the Greek state, was founded in 1928, renamed in 1989 Panteion University of Social and Political Sciences. Since 1984, the Department of Sociology has been developing, cultivating almost all the sub-branches of Science that it is called to heal. The individual subjects that are treated in the Department of Sociology are the following:

The curriculum reflects this multifaceted development of the Department, which allows students to build, after the first two years of compulsory courses, which are the backbone of Sociology, their own specialization as Sociologists. The significant increase in the number of students attending the Department, dictated the most reliable way of scientific reaction of the Department, namely the expansion and specialization of their studies, highlighting the demanding dimension that gives a significant lead in our sociological studies in the country. The objectives of the Department since its establishment were not only to introduce Sociology as an important branch and Science of Social Sciences in Greece, but also to seek the development of Sociology in Greece.

### 2. Summary Presentation of the Undergraduate Program

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#### 2.1 Introduction

The Undergraduate Program of the Department has evolved in recent years, in response both in the course of science development, and the powerful new needs of society at national and global levels.

#### 2.2 *Compulsory courses, compulsory electives, seminars, foreign language and courses outside the Department*

- The total number of courses offered is 156 (including foreign languages and out-of-department courses).
- The courses are divided into compulsory, courses which cover primarily the first four semesters and elective courses which are distributed from the third to the eighth semester.
- The Curriculum includes both Seminars for subjects that require higher specialization and self-action, as well as courses outside the Department chosen by students from other Departments of the University.
- There are no direction courses in the Department and the student is guided by the very structure of the Curriculum and the Department.
- The student is invited with the help of teachers to form his own physiognomy of a Sociologist, forming a body of Elective Courses, of course on the Basic Body of Compulsory, which occupy the first four semesters and allow the construction of any scientific sociological physiology.
- Courses are based on lectures.
- Theoretical teaching identifies studies.
- The use of laboratories concerns special courses such as the application of statistical packages for social research.
- The use of field research is another tool used in student studies.
- The content of the courses is determined by the teachers
- The courses and their content are analyzed and approved by the undergraduate studies committee and then by the General Assembly of the Department.
- The lessons are posted in the form of Syllabus on the website of the Department by each teacher.



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- Members undertake the re-evaluation, and updating of their course material through the Syllabus posted on the website.
- The choice of foreign language is made by the student and the courses are provided by the Department of Foreign Languages.
- The languages taught are English, French, German and Italian.

### ***2.3 Practical Exercise***

#### ***A. Introduction***

Practical Exercise is very important to complete the study of the sociology students to achieve the best possible scientific development and integration of new Sociologists. The bodies to which the Internship is directed involve the sociologists under development in a variety of subjects, such as secretarial support, accounting, documentation, etc.

#### ***B. Participation, Evaluation and Implementing Bodies***

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The selection of students is done after an interview conducted by the supervisors. Priority students participate in the internship of the Department of Sociology. In addition, some positions require basic computer skills and satisfactory English language skills. The positions offered by the bodies are in the field of research, secretarial support, human resources management and public relations. The Internship is conducted in all universities through the Central Support System of the University Internship under the name ATLAS.

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#### **4. Postgraduate Programs**

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##### **4.1 Postgraduate Program in Sociology**

## DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY

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The Postgraduate Program 'Sociology' aims at the education of scientists with wide perception and specialized knowledge on contemporary cutting-edge issues concerning human rights, modern Greece, as well as issues of political and social theory. The MSc was established in 1998 as a cross-departmental and interdisciplinary postgraduate program of studies in the departments of Sociology and Psychology. Since 2004 she has been renamed Postgraduate Studies 'Sociology' and belongs only to the Department of Sociology. The MSc 'Sociology' was approved by the Ministry of Education (Ministerial Decision 51720 / B7 / 5-7-2005, Gov. Gazette FEK 797/13 / 13-7-2005) and operated until the academic year 2013-14. In 2014, the Sociology School was reformed (Gov. Gazette FEK 2307 / τ. B / 27-8-14) and in 2018 it was re-established according to the current legislation (Gov. Gazette FEK 2626 / τ. B / 5-7-18). The postgraduate course is a two-year course of study and is awarded the 'Postgraduate Diploma' (equivalent to DEA and Masters) entitled 'Sociology' and with the following directions:

- a) Social Exclusion and Human Rights
- b) Greek and European Society
- c) Social and Political Theory

The first direction, 'Social Exclusion and Human Rights', studies the phenomenon of social exclusion and human rights. The second, 'Greek and European Society', focuses on the study of contemporary Greek society and its constitution as well as the socio-economic developments taking place in Europe. Finally, the third direction, 'Social and Political Theory', mainly studies the theoretical issues and interpretative forms as they appear in the course of the development of social and political theory and are related to the analysis of social development with particular emphasis on the 21st century. The first semester of study is common to all directions, while from the second semester of study the students attend courses of their own. In the sixth semester, the students prepare their diploma thesis. The admission of new students to the Postgraduate Program is subject to examinations and the relevant call for expressions of interest is published around the end of May each year.

Teachers in the MSc come mostly from the Department of Sociology. The members of the MSc Coordination Committee and the Director with his alternate are elected by the Assembly of the Department for a two-year term. In the sections that follow on the site, you will find more information about the Study Regulation, the lessons, the teachers, the last year's call for expressions of interest and the application for admission to the entrance examination. Further information is also provided by the Secretariat of the Department of Sociology in the hours of cooperation with the students.



### 4.2 Postgraduate Program in Modern Crime and its Countermeasures

The Postgraduate Program of Criminology is operated by the Department of Sociology of the Panteion University as officially recognized by the Ministry of Education Postgraduate since the academic year 2003-2004, initially under the title 'Modern Crime and its Countermeasures' (Government Gazette 1200 / 26- 8-2003) and from July 2014 with its current title (Government Gazette 2006 / 23-7-2014 & 1661 / 10-6-16). In the context of the re-establishment of all the PMS, the current Government FEK is the no. 2485 / 26-6-18.

The Criminology Department has an important tradition in postgraduate studies since it has been operating since 1984, following a decision by the Panteion University Senate. In addition, the Sector of Criminology has been working since 1998 on the direction of Criminology in the Interdisciplinary Postgraduate Program 'Social Exclusion and Minorities' (EPEAEK II CSF) of the Department of Sociology with the participation of the Department of Psychology of the Panteion University as well as the two-year Postgraduate Program Euro-American Cooperation of the Criminal Division, on 'The Globalization of Crime and the Answer to Justice' leading to a joint diploma by six Universities (American University of Washington, Florida State University and Sam Houston-Texas University, Panteion University, University of Bologna and University of Barcelona).

The MSc. offers a Postgraduate Diploma entitled 'Criminology'. The MSc is awarded to those students who successfully complete the course and are assessed positively in the Diploma Thesis. The titles are awarded by the Department of Sociology of the Panteion University of Social and Political Sciences. The aim of the course is to study the main forms of crime and their development in Greece, Europe and internationally, to investigate the factors and processes that create it, as well as to analyze the trends of modern anti-criminal policy.

Graduates of the MSc of Criminology have the opportunity to work as specialized scientists, researchers and consultants, capable of staffing public, public and private services (Ministries of Justice, Transparency and Human Rights, Interior, Education, Lifelong Learning and Religion, Health and Social Solidarity) and in particular police, prisons, minors' care service, social welfare services, various social services (state, municipalities, private bodies), the Councils for Delinquency prevention, Treatment centers of social exclusion (Released (from) dependent, immigrants, the homeless, the unemployed, etc.) or crime victims (abused women, children, etc.) and similar governmental or non-governmental bodies. 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### 5. Doctoral Studies
